The Manitoba Guild of English Handbell Ringers officially became part of the Handbell Guilds of Canada in 1996, thus becoming the link to join the provinces of British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Ontario. Thereafter, all National Conferences of the Handbell Guilds of Canada have been referred to as *The Ringing Link*.

National Chairs of the HGC have alternated between the member provinces as have the Ringing Link Conferences. Morna-June Morrow became National Chair of HGC in 2000 and Patsy Andrews-Vert is the current National Chair.

2015-2016 marks the twentieth anniversary of the Manitoba Guild. It has been determined that the first *Handbell Happening '95* that was held in Starbuck, Manitoba, should be the place where we return to celebrate our 20th anniversary. On April 8th, 1995, ten handbell choirs from Brandon, MacGregor, Starbuck, Stead, Winkler and Winnipeg performed at a concert. Under the direction of Pat Unkenholz from Bismarck, North Dakota, all the choirs rang together in three massed ringing pieces. Two of those massed pieces have been chosen for the 20th anniversary massed ringing. A third massed ringing piece is from the 1997 Spring Ring.



The Handbell World Mourns the Loss of John Nelson



June 24, 1921 - December 25, 2015

John Stephen Nelson, after 94 full years of living, passed on in his sleep on December 25, 2015. John was born June 24, 1921 in Regina, Saskatchewan to Andrew and Elizabeth. He was the last of the Nelson Clan. He joined the RCMP during World War II and was stationed in Halifax where he met Carol. He loved the force, however at that time, officers had to serve seven years before being allowed to marry. Carol won out and John left the force to marry Carol on October 2, 1945.

Over the years he served as a Manufacturer's Agent for a number of companies, but the one he loved the most was his 53 years as District Sales Manager for Schulmerich Carillons. He had a great passion for handbells and carillons and was the impetus for many handbells choirs across Canada. He was instrumental in establishing the Alberta Guild of Handbell Ringing and assisted with the formation of other guilds throughout Canada. He retired at 89 after winning "salesman of the year!" John leaves behind his loving wife of 70 years Carol, two sons (John (Debby) and Gary (Carla); four grandchildren and six great grandchildren. A celebration of John's Life and Faith was held at First Baptist Church in Calgary, where John and Carol were faithful members for over 64 years. We are thankful to John for all that he has done to advance the art of handbell ringing in Canada!
