## The Copper Ring in Worthington, MN



## An Exchange Between Peers

Rochester Area Handbells (RAH) and the St. Olaf Handbell Choir (SOHC) recently met up for an exchange, a repeat of an experiment they tried two years ago. Patterned after a masterclass, we used a format where one group would play a piece while the other watched and then provided feedback. Even though we gave them permission to give helpful criticism as well as compliments, in typical handbell fashion the ringers gave almost entirely supportive comments.

Each group played three pieces. One of the SOHC pieces was composed by a current student, and the RAH members were very supportive and encouraged him to get the piece published. The RAH ringers were inspired by SOHC's speed, precision, and communication among the ringers. The two groups play on different brands of bells (SOHC on Malmarks, RAH on Schulmerich) and the students found it interesting to hear the difference in the sound. RAH also brought some of their additional bells (Whitechapels and Petit-Fritsen) and the SOHC ringers enjoyed hearing and trying those out.

A major goal of this exchange was to expose SOHC ringers to the idea of ringing after college. College students are all at about the same stage of life, and some have no ringing experience other than in college. So it broadened their minds to see ringers at all stages of life, and often with decades of ringing under their belts. RAH encouraged SOHC ringers to continue ringing and to seek out advanced opportunities at local, Area, and national events.

At the end the two groups played a piece together — Lee Afdahl's wonderful "Gopak" which happened to be in the concert rotation for each group. It was so much fun we played it twice! In addition to ringing, the two groups had time to mingle and share some homemade snacks.

We hope an event like this serves as a model for other groups to find opportunities to connect. Handbell ringing is ultimately about interpersonal connections, and any chance to form these connections helps lead to the creation of lifelong ringers. RAH and SOHC look forward to repeating this exchange again in the future, and RAH is looking for other college or community groups to partner with for similar exchanges.



In December, MQHR had the honor of performing as guest musicians with the Milwaukee area's Concord Chamber Orchestra in their holiday concert. Sharing the stage with the orchestra was a transformative experience for the fledgling ensemble. Doing so, elevated their performance practice as they brought the brilliance of bells to the orchestra's already rich sound. Many audience members shared how much they enjoyed the ensemble's performance after the concert.

These musicians remain deeply moved by the many individuals and organizations, both near and far, who have reached out to support them financially, artistically, and emotionally. They feel your love and are full of gratitude.

Currently, the group is preparing for "Ringing Queens: A Pop Concert," which is coming up quickly on May 17-18, 2025. This show features a vibrant mix of music. This includes AGEHR Level 4 pieces that pushed them musically and strengthened them as an ensemble. It's been a labor of love, shaped by dedication and collaboration from every member. Over four months, with sixteen rehearsals (each over two hours long) and one epic six-hour Saturday session, the musicians have worked tirelessly to prepare something truly special. They can't wait to share it with you, a diverse and captivating selection of music that spans not just decades, but centuries. Indeed, it's a performance not to be missed!

If you're in the Milwaukee, WI area, know how to read music, and support the rights of and care about creating affirming spaces for LGBTQ+ folks, please join them! MQHR's mission is to live out these core values:

- Community, by bringing together musicians who identify as LGBTQ and beyond.
- Joy, through music-making.
- Inclusion, by creating a space where people of all backgrounds can express their authentic selves.
- Performance, by striving to create beautiful music across many genres; and
- Education, by telling both untold and familiar stories through music and word.

The Milwaukee LGBTQ+ Handbell Ringers strive to make meaningful contributions to both the LGBTQ+ and broader Milwaukee communities, and to take their place in the long and rich history of queer art and artists. In that sense — and perhaps out of necessity — they embrace their identity with pride.

Does that make the ensemble political? In a time when the existence of LGBTQ+ people, especially for youth and those who fall under the trans umbrella, is being actively challenged, and when the basic promise of "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness" is being denied to so many, they echo the chant first raised by ACT UP during the AIDS crisis nearly 40 years ago: "We're here! We're queer! Get used to it!" Or to put it musically, as the amazing composer Abbie Betinis wrote in her anthem for Justice Choir (MN): "Resilience. We are strong. Shoulder to shoulder, keep moving on."

# An interview with Carol Scheel – businesswoman, composer, musician, and friend.

I had the distinct pleasure of sitting down with our friend, Carol Scheel, for a candid visit about bells and about life. Carol is a most fascinating person — even more interesting than we ever knew.

Carol comes from an academic family. Her parents were both scientists. They moved from the Detroit area to Vermillion, South Dakota where her father accepted a job as head of the biochemistry department at the University of South Dakota. She was 13.

Carol played the piano all through school and into college at Vermillion. After high school she attended

Interlocken Summer Camp and even played for Van Cliburn! During her college years she transferred to the University of Michigan for a time to pursue more piano instruction. However, they decided that piano performance might not be the correct course for her. While at Vermillion the Luther Center was home base and she changed her major to theater (also math, chemistry, and French.) She had the good fortune of seeing productions of the Covenant Players and eventually toured with them. She was fascinated with the idea of presenting faith-based themes on stage.

She graduated with a degree in chemistry and minors in French and math — minus 1 class. Her father really wanted her to complete the entire degree, so she later attended Gustavus Adulphus and graduated with a BA in Distributive Sciences. Whew!

More school...Carol enrolled at Luther Northwestern Seminary to be come a Lutheran pastor. While at seminary she met a fellow student, Frank Scheel, whom she married after one year. They moved to Lancaster, Ohio for Frank's internship but did not continue with seminary.



Carol and Frank attended North Heights Church in Arden Hills, Minnesota and got involved in the contemporary music department. It is here that Carol saw the youth bell choir perform, and she knew that she had to try it. She eventually got involved with the adult bell choir and even became a youth bell choir director. She also worked at McDonald's, was a home caregiver, and a preschool substitute teacher. She then attended St. Thomas University where she completed a Master of Arts with a licensure in Early Childhood Special Education. She worked as a job coach with adults who have cognitive disabilities.

Carol met Norm Heitz at an Area reading session. Norm had started Heitz Handbell House in 1983 and was often at area events. Carol still wanted to work in music, so she convinced Norm that they should work together, and in January of 2010 they were business partners. The store had lots of bell music but also piano, organ, and choral music. Their business was in various locations and eventually made its way to 6603 Queen Avenue South in Richfield, Minnesota. Norm died in 2013.

At that location, people were free to browse, play through music, and visit. Remember when we went to reading sessions, listened to CDs, and paged through publisher catalogues? Then came COVID. Naturally, business severely declined. Since COVID, most musicians listen to and order music online, so Carol made the decision to move her business to her home garage. Interesting fact: Area 7 is not her biggest customer base.

Carol goes to many festivals and ringing events to sell her wares. T-shirts, gloves, handbell key chains, decorations, and embroidered towels are popular items, as well as music. She is especially interested in showcasing music for small ensembles and bell tree music. She really enjoys seeing her friends around the country and making new ones. She told me that she even keeps a chair at her booth for people to just "chill." She is quite willing to visit with them or just let them de-stress from the overwhelming pressure. Not everyone is an extrovert.

Outside of the bell world, Carol loves to read, do puzzles, and (of course) play the piano. She is a constant learner and has pursued composition.

She has a special place in her heart for the late composer, Arnold Sherman, who coached her at music writing seminars.

So, what's next at Heitz Handbells? Carol let me know that the business can be quite consuming — filling online orders, bookkeeping, hauling music, and doing website maintenance. So Carol is hoping that someone might like to purchase the business. Yes, she might be ready to retire. With all of the business burdens and life's challenges, Carol is still the enthusiastic musician, colleague, and friend! I say bravo to a full life of learning and growing and serving.

### From the Southern Wisconsin Sub-Chair





## From the C.H.I.M.E. Representative

Area 7 CHIME Grant: Mutiple sets available, many reasons to apply

Area 7 is now accepting applications for CHIME Grants that will be awarded for the 2025-2026 program year.

The Committee for Handbells in Music Education (CHIME) encourages schools and other educational or community organizations to develop music education programs using handbells or handchimes in their curriculum. To enable the start and growth of these programs, Area 7 has five CHIME Grants available to be awarded each program year (September-May). The Grant provides a 3-octave set of handbells or chimes, foam pads, music, technique manuals, curriculum suggestions, and mentoring to support the organization throughout the term of the grant.

The Grant has also been awarded to support existing handbell programs that may need an additional set of bells for shorter periods due to various reasons. Some examples from the past include groups that had

an increased number of participants in the program, a special performance that combined multiple choirs together, or their bells/chimes were away for maintenance.

The Grant has been awarded to schools, churches, senior living facilities and other community organizations within the Area 7 region. Some awardees in the past years include:


