# The New Composers Initiative: Growing the Next Generation of Handbell Composers

The Donald E. Allured Original Composition Award is pleased to announce a new initiative for the creation of handbell music. Established in partnership with the Handbell Musicians of America, the New Composers Initiative will identify and support new talent seeking to break into the world of published handbell music. Recipients will be mentored by an established composer, receive a cash fee for their composition, have their work published by AGEHR, and have their work premiered at a prestigious HMA-sponsored event.

The New Composers Initiative's inaugural award in 2025 went to Aryaman Joshi of Minneapolis. Aryaman graduated from St. Olaf College in 2023 with a B.A. in Music Composition and Mathematics with a Data Science Minor. During his time at St. Olaf, he studied composition under Dr. Timothy Mahr and Dr. Justin Merritt. He currently rings with Ring Out! in the Twin Cities. His composition, tentatively titled "Za'atar" integrates Arabic modes, rhythms, and ornaments. It will be premiered at Distinctly Teen 2026.

The New Composers Initiative is currently looking for the next recipient of the award. Interested applicants should have acquired the musical expertise and compositional skills necessary to produce an original handbell work which meets the standards to be premiered at a major HMA event.



Because the Initiative is designed to promote new composers, applicants should have no more than two handbell compositions accepted by an established music publishing house.

Applications will be accepted at <u>weekofhandbells</u>. <u>com/newcomposers</u> from Jan 1, 2026 until Feb 28, 2026. The winner will be announced by March 31, 2026. Composers wishing to be considered for the award should submit:

- 1. A comprehensive sampling of their compositional output, as possible with sound files, which demonstrates the applicant's understanding of music theory and the handbell idiom. Examples need not be restricted to compositions for handbells, but at least one work must demonstrate an understanding of the handbell idiom.
- 2. A brief (250-word) statement sharing their vision for the sponsored commission, including any ideas that might be considered unique and innovative.
- 3. Contact information for a reference who can speak to the applicant's talent and skills as a composer.

The composer selected for this award will be closely managed to ensure completion of the composition.

The Donald E. Allured Original Composition Award was originally established in 1993 by attendees of the Bay View Week of Handbells to honor and ensure an appropriate legacy for Mr. Allured. The purpose of the Award was to commission original handbell music that would exemplify the highest standards and expectations that Donald Allured would demand in such works. Since its inception, the Award has commissioned compositions from many of the field's most prominent composers for premiere at the Bay View Week of Handbells concert. While the Allured Award enthusiastically continues this activity, it also seeks to expand the pool of capable composers to carry the art into the future. 
# A New Handbell Organization

# Ensemble Spotlight: Bell Crazy — Joy!

There's a new handbell choir in town.

Meet Bell Crazy, an ensemble in Lake Mills, Wisconsin, that has spent the past two years forming, expanding, and ringing under the direction of Karen Johnson.

It's such a delight for me to see our handbell community growing and thriving, so of course I wanted to know more. How did Bell Crazy come about?

The answer is all about joy.

When Karen and her husband, Neil, relocated to be closer to grandchildren, she left behind decades of experiences. Those experiences included 34 years as a high school band director, plus the wealth of extra involvement that can entail. They also included being a church's bell choir director, which she expanded from one 2-octave choir to two choirs playing 4 octaves.

After relocating, Karen filled her time with music ensembles, quilting, and family. She joined a community handbell ensemble, their new church home's bell choir, and a community band. But she found she was really missing conducting and leading an ensemble. Her supportive husband suggested starting a bell choir, and the result is Bell Crazy.

With encouragement and support from some handbell friends, they started from scratch, putting a planned remodel on hold to buy equipment.

Karen and Neil drove to Austin, Texas, to purchase a used 3½-octave set of Malmark Handbells. They drove down over two days, made the purchase, and began the journey home, which included a visit with their grandson at Iowa State University. They'd planned to spend the night in Ames, Iowa, but a massive storm was looming, so they checked out of their hotel, loaded up the bells, and drove to beat the storm. (They did.) With bells in hand, they purchased tables, foam, binders, "rehearsal" table covers, risers, gloves, various supplies, mallets, and music to get started.

The encouraging handbell friends not only gave emotional and generous monetary support, but said they'd play if Karen directed. Two were not active in a community ensemble at the time; the third was on the fence regarding her status. They contacted others and word spread. A couple of people from the church bell choir joined. Others were recruited, including a college friend and a former student. Karen's daughter and daughter-in-law asked to join. Ringers had a wide range of abilities, from beginners to having played for over 30 years.

Karen held the first Bell Crazy rehearsal on March 18, 2023. And yes, it brought joy.

"Oh, the JOY I felt to have this wonderful group of people come together to share making music with handbells."

Bell Crazy rehearses in Karen's walk-out basement. It has no affiliation with a church. There are no salaries. Karen is the director and owner. Members are asked to pay a \$50 membership fee each semester to help with the cost of music and supplies. Bell Crazy's goal is to share their passion for ringing handbells with the community and each other.

The group expanded, adding chimes and ordering its upper 4th octave of bells in 2023.

Bell Crazy's first performance was on Saturday, December 2, 2023, at Stair Crest Retirement Community in Muskego, WI. Its December concerts have been titled 'Bringing Holiday Joy,' and the choir performed the following Saturday, at Grace Lutheran Church in Cambridge, WI.





"Bringing Holiday Joy" continues even after the concert concludes. (December, 2024.)

"During our first performance at the retirement community, the director of the facility interrupted the concert because the pharmacy was there to deliver prescriptions. That's when we did the impromptu 'handbell/chime technique talk/demo.' It was unexpected by the choir but their reaction was 'We should do that at every concert, I know my family would be interested to hear this...I learned some things as well.' So that was cool."

Bell Crazy ordered more bells, refurbished its original 3½ octaves, and purchased a 5th octave of chimes in 2024.

"At our December 2024 performance, a gentleman came up after our performance and asked if he could join! Well, that was a pleasant surprise and a welcome one. At the time I could only offer him an option to sub, but circumstances changed, and he is now one of our bass ringers."

Neil has printed 3-D practice bells (non-ringing) for a few individuals to work with at home. Son Aaron designed Bell Crazy's logo and serves as its photographer.

Today, Bell Crazy is a full 5-octave choir (handbells and chimes), with an extra 4-octave set of handbells to help resolve impossible situations in the music. It rehearses for 2½ hours twice a month for 6-7 rehearsals in advance of early December concerts, then breaks over the holidays. It rejoins for a spring session, then breaks over summer. Last year it started having a mini-retreat day for one rehearsal, which gives members an opportunity to bond as a group over a meal and through conversation. Some of its members take advantage of summer conferences. It had a group attend the Area 7 Festival in LaCrosse in June 2024 as well as Handbell Camp in July 2025.

"Our future hopes and plans are to keep doing what we have started and continue to grow as a handbell ensemble. This is the start of our third year of performing and I am so proud of the growth of the ensemble. The gap between beginners and experienced musicians is narrowing every rehearsal and performance. We truly enjoy making music together and sharing it with our audiences. It's all about the music and the time together. Bringing joy to anyone and everyone wanting to experience."

You can see Bell Crazy perform at the Lake Mills High School Auditorium in Lake Mills, WI, at 2pm, Saturday, December 6, and at Grace Lutheran Church in Cambridge, WI, at 2pm, Sunday, December 7. The concerts are titled "Bringing Holiday Joy". Performances are all free admission. Bell Crazy does accept donations, which go to building its music library, equipment maintenance, and instruments.

Does Karen have advice for anyone else thinking of maybe starting a community handbell choir?

"You need a space, instruments, equipment, music, and a passion for sharing music. Have fun, find the JOY!"

- 44 sets of 4- to 5-octave handchimes
- 22 sets of 3-octave handchimes
- 1,752 feet of table foam (584 pads!)

Your loaned equipment is picked up and delivered back to you and is fully insured while away from your building. In the many decades of hosting Area 7 Festivals, every bell and chime were returned safe and sound.
